## Quiz/Test Corrections

If you earned at least a $70 \%$ on a quiz or test, you will have the option to do corrections to improve your understanding and your score. If you earned below a $70 \%$, you will be required to do corrections. You must complete the corrections during lunchtime within 5 days for tests and 2 days for quizzes. If you do not complete required corrections, you will be assigned lunch detention to complete them.

Successful completion of corrections will earn $1 / 2$ credit back on your score (for example, if you missed 10 points, you could earn back a maximum of 5 points through corrections).
